The Fosse Foodbank has been open in Southam for three years, in that time, up to June of this year, we've helped approximately 275 adults and 122 children with food items, toiletries and food vouchers. I also took some items to the Leamington Spa Night Shelter where I volunteer on a Wednesday night, these were received with great glee, as they have so little of life's luxuries."
