The donations are sent on a regular basis to the Mothers' Union International Projects, totalling several hundreds of pounds each year. The morning ends at noon with the Cross of Nails prayers; these prayers are said worldwide by churches and communities belonging to the Fellowship of the Cross of Nails.

Remembering....

As I sit and write this to you at the beginning of October, the warmth and light of the summer evenings seem distant memories as the darker evenings have set in and there's definitely an autumnal chill in the air!

Each year I always think that September won't be quite as busy, after being lulled into a different pattern over the summer weeks, and each year I discover that I hit the ground running with new school terms, baptisms, planning for Harvest celebrations, Remembrance Sunday and dare I say thinking about the Christmas events and celebrations!

Years ago, I read the phrase that people come into your life for a reason, a season or a lifetime. I have often pondered on that. The role of a vicar is very much a varied life and so this phrase is very apt in describing people that I meet. During the seasons of the church, there are times of great joy and thanksgiving for example at the celebration of a birth or a baptism or a wedding, but then there are harder times too when I meet folk who are in pain, or who are hurting or who are facing difficulties in life. I consider it a privilege to journey alongside people especially families who have lost loved ones, to listen as they share their memories and to offer them hope in their time of grief.

Having experienced great loss of loved ones myself, I know that you simply don't 'get over' the loss, but over time you learn to live with the grief and there will be good days and there will be bad days along the way. One of the ways that St James offers support is through a short reflective service called 'Living with Loss'. It's a time of peace and to remember before God those whom we grieve for. This year it's on Sunday November 4th at 4pm and is followed by a cuppa and a cake for those who would like to stay after the service.

Remembrance Sunday is a very special day to remember and honour those who have fought, been injured or paid the ultimate sacrifice of their lives during both World Wars and later conflicts. This year, of course, is an even more special time of remembrance as it is the Centenary of the end of WW1 and it actually falls in a Sunday. St James church will hold its usual service from 10:30, but we are also pleased to be involved, alongside the Town Council and uniformed brigades, in one of the National Beacon services that are happening across the nation. Southam's Beacon Service is going to be held at the recreation ground....

Folk to gather at 6:45 for the Beacon to be lit at 7pm. It will be good to see you there.

Christmas 2018 at Carriers of Hope

Dear Friends

It's that time of year again!!! Our aim this year is to bring Christmas joy to 300 families in just 8 weeks time!!!

What is Christmas-dinner-in-a-bag all about?

Would you like to join us in doing something to let our asylum seeker, refugee and EU Migrant families know that people really care about their situation? Can we bring some love, joy and hope to them this Christmas by providing them with a Christmas-Dinner-in-a Bag between Tuesday 18th – Saturday 22nd December?

Over these five days bags will be distributed to 300 families, containing the makings of a Christmas celebration. The average cost of a bag is £25 and they contain:

A £10 supermarket gift card to buy fresh food and fresh fruit and vegetables;

A box of crackers;

A cake; Pudding of some kind (probably not a Christmas pudding as many of our families have no microwaves - and don't know what a Christmas pud is!); Biscuits; Sweets; Mincepies;

A Christmas card from you with a personal message of support. We also pop in a little gift such as one of the knitted teddies, received from a local knitting group.

There are various ways you can help:

- 1. You can bring a made up bag to our warehouse at Unit 2C Swallowgate Business Park, Holbrook Lane CV6 4BL
- 2. You can deliver a made up bag to the address below; or to Katie Wilson's house (27, Fraser Road, CV6 2EU).
- 3. You can send money towards the cost of making up a bag. (Cheques made payable to Carriers of Hope), to the address below.
- 4. You can make a bank transfer into the Carriers of Hope bank account (contact me for the bank details).
- 5. You can buy items from the shopping list and bring to Katie's house, my house or the warehouse (see addresses in 1 & 2 above).

 Any of the above will be great.
