Thought for the month for December from Barry Parker- Churchwarden

Christmas can be a time of extraordinary hope and considerable despair. Christmas can focus memories and emotions. So, what are your expectations, what are you hoping for, what are you looking for this year?

The Christmas Lights in Southam have already been switched on and the town takes on a magical appearance after dark and I'm sure that many of you will soon be decorating your homes, if you have not already done so!

Everywhere we look we see the commercial side of Christmas, being bombarded with advertising for those material things you must have. Not only drink and traditional food like turkeys, Christmas puddings, mince pies, Christmas cakes, etc. but also the latest electronic gadgets, the toys and merchandise from the latest film, that new three piece suite, perhaps even a holiday..... the list goes on and on and I will leave it to you to fill in the blanks. Children across our community are looking ahead, counting down the days to Christmas. Their excitement is building at school with Christmas parties, Christmas plays and carol services.

Christmas is also a time of year when many look back over their lives, remembering times gone by, both good and bad. This can be such a difficult time for many. Christmas planning is well under way and we have a wonderful team of Christmas Elves each Tuesday afternoon, bagging up Christmas-Dinners-in-a-Bag; and Christmas presents.
