A 'Blue' Planet

We're coming up now to a time that we may take a holiday or a few days break. Maybe we'll go and enjoy the local countryside or take a trip to the coast, sit on a beach, listen to the waves lapping or crashing (!) Taking moments to notice the beauty of the earth, the intricacies of creation, a child's delight as they jump waves....or an adults for that matter!

"The oceans cover 71% of the Earth and our planet could equally well be called Ocean as opposed to Earth. Seen from space our planet is indeed a beautiful 'blue marble' spinning in the vastness of the cosmos and, as far as we know, the only place in the universe with intelligent beings who can contemplate and understand something of themselves and the creation in which they live."¹

Over the past couple of years, I've recognised that an awareness and a passion for the earth, and how we look after it, has been growing in me and also in many people who I talk to. From the very first book in the Bible and all the way through to the last one, we read of the beauty of the earth. And right from the beginning, we are called to be stewards of it. It has been entrusted to us. And finally, crisp packet recycling – a friend of mine is collecting crisp packets to be recycled instead of going to landfill. We as a family probably eat 10-15 bags a week which over the course of a year could be as many as 780 packets. By recycling them they are cleaned and shredded to turn them into plastic pellets. These pellets are then transformed into park benches, plant pots, watering cans and cool bags. Amazing! There is a collection box in Church on the window sill next to the tables where refreshments are served please pop packets in there. The only stipulation is they have to have the silver lining inside the packets – which most of them do.
