Thought for the month of August from Rev. Vikki Bisiker

Welcome!

One of the privileges of being a priest is being able to welcome babies, children and adults into the church family through Baptism (also called Christenings within the Anglican church). Generally with the warmer weather of summer months, the church becomes busy celebrating with families making their Baptism promises. This year, I've also had the privilege of helping both the Reception class of Southam St James CofE Academy and years 3/4 from Southam Primary with their RE curriculum specifically in the area of Baptism. (I'm also looking forward to another wedding re-enactment for Southam Primary's Reception class, but that's a story for another article!)

It was great fun to welcome the children into St James' church, help them learn about baptism and for them to explore the church building too. Reception class took part in a baptism re-enactment and celebrated with juice and biscuits afterwards. Years 3/4 came ready with a whole host of questions to ask me about baptism.....they certainly kept me on my toes and gave me a real grilling about what it all meant, the symbolism of the water and the lit candle, as well as asking questions like "Who's been the oldest person you've baptised?" and "What presents do you get when you're baptised?"!!! In the end we ran out of time for questions and they still had more!

The teachers had done a fantastic job of making this area of the curriculum engaging, informative and fun. All of the children had been asked to bring photos or gifts or mementos into school of either their baptism or maybe of a family member's baptism. So a big SHOUT OUT to those teachers doing an incredible job of making learning fun!

Whatever faith you are and whether that is a strong faith or no faith at all or anything in between, I feel that being welcome and belonging is such a deep part of what it is to be human. As Christians, through baptism, we are showing that we want to be part of, to belong to God's family. Being part of that family, we then try and live in the best way that we can as we follow Jesus together. That is what Church is. It's the family of God. It's not perfect and yes we all make mistakes and unwise decisions from time to time, we are only human! But from my experience God is a God of Love, Forgiveness and Grace and that's the journey that we are on too with each other and with those around us...our family, our neighbours, our work colleagues, our friends.....

"How does that look in practice?" is a question I'm often asked. Well here's a challenge for you....

The Church of England is encouraging individual Christians and churches to sign up to a voluntary pledge to help make social media and the web more widely positive places for conversations to happen. The comments that we make online can reach thousands and even millions of people across the globe. That includes negative as well as positive comments! I think we've all seen online or heard conversations in person turn toxic within a few comments. So the challenge is to be loving and generous online as well as face to face. Let's see if we can each play our part to make a difference to those around us and our amazing community. Cup a Soup does not – this means it has a small amount of metal inside the packaging.

This is hopefully just the start of a developing list. For those who are Tech Savvy there is an app you can download on your phone for free called Refill. The app lets you see where you can refill your water bottles and also allows you to track how many times you refill and therefore how many bottles and carbon you have saved. This is a UK wide app so also good for when you are on holiday!

FACT - If just 1 in 10 of Brits refilled once a week, we'd have 340 MILLION less plastic bottles a year in circulation!
