Thought for the month of September from Ali Hine ExecHead –

Southam St James CofE Academy and Long Itchington CofE Academy

At the end of my first year as Executive Headteacher at Southam St James C of E Academy and Long Itchington C of E Academy I am delighted to have been asked to contribute the 'Thought for the Month'. As someone who has dedicated 25 years to educating children, I firmly believe the message in Psalms 127:3 'Children are a gift from God; they are his reward.' I love my job - It is a privilege to watch children develop and grow. They never cease to amaze me with their joy for learning, passion for life and ability to forge firm friendships based on love and forgiveness. This is as true today as it was when I started teaching 25 years ago, even though the world around us is changing in ways we could never have foreseen - some positive and some of which are extremely concerning.

As the leader of two excellent Church Schools, I believe that these places provide stability in an increasingly unstable world, be it at a personal or international level, with its foundations firmly rooted in Christianity and its core values. They provide children with the knowledge and reassurance that they are loved and are created in the image of God, whilst expertly providing them with the practical skills required to progress through life, such as reading and writing, music and art. They are about humanity and compassion, about being aware of others and respecting everyone for what they are. They ensure that education in the broadest sense of the word is a key part of their purpose.

The Church of England has always been concerned with education in many forms and the history of Church schools began when the National Society for the Promotion of Education was founded in 1811.

Despite the number of people regularly attending church falling below 1 million in 2014, Church Schools are still flourishing 208 years after their foundation, with approximately 1 million children attending Church of England schools.

In fact, a quarter of primary schools are Church of England School and about 15 million people alive today went to a Church of England school. However, despite these impressive figures, one question that I am often asked is what is the difference in the schools I lead being Church of England schools?

My answer is simply that Church schools have Christian beliefs and value at their heart. This means that every child and adult associated with the school is not just important because they are members of the school but because they are seen as unique individuals within God's creation.

As a leader of church schools, I have a role to ensure that my leadership encompasses three main aspects; that of servant-leader, where I encourage the educational and spiritual growth of children in my care ; that of transformational leadership where Christian values permeate the whole life of the school ; and that of invitational leadership where all are welcome. This in my opinion creates schools that not only believe in the Christian values, but live the values in their daily life. In an increasingly uncertain world, surely this is vital for our children.



Lots has been happening over the summer, at Carriers of Hope

Well, we may have been closed on Tuesday mornings but LOTS has been happening:

1. We had a very successful Uniform distribution, with over 160 children receiving support, so far, with money for new school uniform items, plus a similar number receiving good quality second-hand items.
2. The seaside trip for the client-volunteers and their families resulted in 150 people having a lovely day at Weston-super-Mare.
3. We have a new clerk to the Board of Trustees. Phamie Toner, who has many years of supporting Boards of Governors, in schools, has been appointed - and has already started.
4. From a field of 9 potential new trustees, 5 have been appointed to join, and strengthen, the board.
5. One of our emerging Social Enterprises has been launched. Twinning Solutions, Coventry CIC will be seeking elderly and housebound customers, to which we will match well-trained carers from a range of different cultural and faith backgrounds.
6. The second of our Social Enterprises has a name - Chrysalis. This one will be turning waste into beautiful products which we aim to sell, to create employment opportunities for some of our "crafty" clients, recruited from the craft and sewing group.
7. We are appointing a new leader of the Baby Project, in the next few days.

Now, we look forward to the restart of Circle of Friends, on Tuesday 10th September, at Hillfields Church. Do, please, come and visit us, if you are able. Any Tuesday morning - between 9.00 - 10.00 is best.

And, if you have time to give us on the Business Development side, you will be ESPECIALLY welcome.
