Thought for the month of November from Stephan Adams - Churchwarden

“November's night is dark and drear, the dullest month of all the year.”
Words from L. E. Landon sum up the thoughts of many writers and poets about this month!

Apart from the fun and fireworks at the beginning of the month, November can be very dull as the autumn colours have now disappeared and the nights are long and the weather is wetter and colder. I feel I can understand why some animals hibernate!

The big event in our community this month is our Remembrance Parade and the service hosted at St James, when we take that special time to remember together those whose lives were cut short by war and conflict, and to acknowledge our gratitude for the lives we now enjoy as a result of all their sacrifices.

Many hopes and dreams left unfulfilled. My wife Pat recently drew my attention to something she had read and it seemed a good idea to repeat it here: In a 1985 newspaper essay an American lady called Anne Wells wrote, ‘My brother-in-law opened my sister’s bureau and drew out a tissue wrapped package. It was an exquisite silk handmade slip; the price tag with an astronomical figure on it was still attached. “Jan bought this the first time we went to New York eight or nine years ago,” he said. “She never wore it; she was saving it for a special occasion. Well I guess this is the occasion.” He put the slip on the bed with the other clothes we were taking to the mortician. Then he turned to me, “Don’t ever save anything for a special occasion. Every day you’re alive is a special occasion!”’ Anne Wells continued, ‘I’m not saving anything anymore. Now we use our good china – for every “occasion”. “Someday” and “one of these days” are fighting a losing battle to stay in my vocabulary. If it’s worth seeing, hearing or doing, I want to see, hear, and do it now. I’m trying very hard not to put off, hold back, or save anything that could add laughter or lustre to our lives. And every morning when I open my eyes I tell myself this is a special occasion.’

Part of a prayer written in the Bible says, “Teach us to number our days so that we may gain a heart of wisdom.” So let’s try and ignore that voice in our head that says ‘You can do it later.’ Don’t waste a day. Do it *now* - visit an old friend, pop across the road to a neighbour, learn a new skill, tell someone you love them, forgive that person who upset you, take that trip.

Start today to do that thing that you’ve been putting off.
