Thought for the month of January from Barry Parker Churchwarden

As I am writing this thought for the month the Christmas lights are going up in the town centre in anticipation of the fun and festivities of the Christmas Lights Switch-On. By the time you read this, the excitement, preparations and celebrations for Christmas and the New Year will have passed. Indeed, the lights may already have been taken down for another year!

For many, time with family and friends over this festive period has been a precious gift, building memories, for others it may have been a time of heartache as all they have are memories.

How have you started 2020? Is it filled with promise and possibilities, are you looking forward to making the most of a new year? Or are you looking backwards, holding on to those same worries, regrets and emotional pains that wear us down and make it difficult to move forward? Each day, each year is a gift from God, allowing us to experience the freshness of His grace and mercy, to release burdens and hurts of the past, to take a deep breath and renew our vision for the future.

Each year is like turning a page in the story of life. It's a new beginning and the page is always blank ready to be filled with the next part of our life story. Clearly, none of us knows what the future holds but the decisions you make, your circumstances and the people you meet will all form a part of your story. Will your story leave a lasting legacy?

Two thousand years ago Jesus Christ stepped into the blank pages of our human story. Although His story had been prophesied few people recognised Jesus as the Son of God and many rejected him. Jesus became a carpenter but at the age of 30 he left home to start a time of teaching and healing and established a new community that would continue the changes he brought about. Jesus' time on earth was limited but he changed the human story for ever. He literally split history in two BCE and CE (previously BC and AD!). The impact of his crucifixion and amazing resurrection dramatically impacted the lives of his followers. Many went on to record his teachings, which are part of the New testament in the Bible, and remain relevant today.

We all have a life story which is precious in God's eyes and he longs for each one of us to accept his offer of eternal life in His kingdom. We can, therefore, choose to approach 2020 with excitement and optimism, not despair and disillusion. This year could be the beginning of a new story for you, written around the never-ending existence with Jesus in His perfect world.

Corrie Ten Boom, who was sentenced to a concentration camp during WWII, said this, “Never be afraid to trust an unknown future to a known God.” With our faith in God, we can be excited and enthusiastic about this coming year. He will guide our steps. What the prophet, Jeremiah, said to those who were exiled and facing an unknown future, is just as true today, “For I know the plans and thoughts that I have for you, say the Lord, plans for peace and well-being and not for disaster, to give you a future and a hope.”

Vacancies

Treasurer - How do you fancy looking after our church finances? From our Annual General Meeting in March we need a new church treasurer. It would be very helpful if you have an interest in figures and preferably able to use a computer accounts package. We have a very good system designed by Christians with charities and churches in mind. A helpline is available each weekday. Ruth will give every assistance to a new treasurer and is happy to continue as Gift Aid secretary – a completely separate computer package. Main attributes are that the person is trustworthy and can act in a confidential manner.

Other - In addition to looking for someone to take over from Ruth as our church treasurer we are also looking for volunteers to cover the following roles:-

Health and Safety Officer - as a church we owe a duty of care to ensure the safety of those who visit or use our church or churchyard. Working with the PCC we are looking for someone to have specific responsibility for our health and safety policy and its implementation, assessing the risks to health and safety of users of the church. Experience in the area of health and safety whilst an advantage is not essential. If you think this might be you please have a word with Barry Parker who can provide further information.

Web Master - We are looking for someone to take over from Barry Parker who currently manages the church website. This is an important role as it is imperative that any information regarding church services, activities, etc. are kept up to date. I am sure you would agree that the website is the public face of the church and the first place new people to the area look. With the website in place the role includes uploading the weekly Bulletin, maintaining the church diary and publishing items of latest news. Full training and support will be given. For more information please speak with Barry.

Fabric - We are looking for volunteers to be part of our fabric committee. The PCC is responsible for the care and maintenance of the church fabric and its contents (including the churchyard). Reporting to the PCC the fabric committee takes an active role not just in planning and commissioning routine maintenance works but also in those areas requiring major works/refurbishment, including the church tower and a leaking south aisle roof, together with an ageing central heating system. You can probably identify others. With the Diocese expected to cancel our arrears of parish share early in the new year, something we have mentioned in the Annual Reports over the past few years, we will then be in a position to apply for grant aid for items of major repair and refurbishment. Please have a word with Stephen Adams for more information.

These are all key roles in the maintenance, development and mission of St James in our community so please prayerfully consider how you might be able to help. Thank you.
