Thought for the month of March from Rev. Vikki Bisikker

"I go to bed hopeful and I get up thankful"

Have you ever had a time when someone's words seem to stay with you or strike a chord in you? I heard these words, "I go to bed hopeful and I get up thankful", in a short video that Archbishop Justin had recorded about Exploring Prayer. He was recollecting a person whom he knew who had said these words and why this person had a grateful heart.

I got to pondering on this short sentence of simple words....What is it that makes us hopeful....what is it that we are thankful for...what is it that makes us get up out of bed?!

From experience, it's easy to say we're hopeful and be thankful when times are good, but sometimes that's not so easy when we're facing tough times, particularly if that's over a long period. We can get worn down and it can be difficult to see the everyday blessings in life.

A while ago, in a little notebook, I started to write down at least five things each day that I was thankful to God and include these things in my prayers. Thinking of things to be grateful for on some days wasn't as easy as other days! Some days I must confess that I didn't do it, not through lack of wanting, but due to busyness, tiredness or forgetfulness. (Terrible confession I know, but Vicars are only human too!)

But even spending that short amount of time each evening saying Thank you can shift our thinking and move our hearts into ones of gratitude and maybe go to bed more hopeful knowing the Creator God who made us has more blessings for us each new day.

If you think that prayer isn't for you or you wouldn't know where to start, can I ask you to rethink that....? You don't have to find fancy words or have your prayer all planned out before you utter a word or think that you could never pray like someone else does. You just have to be you, because that's who God created. The Thankfulness notebook mentioned above is a way of thanking God and is a way of praying. Someone calling out to God in desperation is praying...there are plenty of examples of this in the Book of Psalms in the Bible! There are lots of ways of praying, because prayer is about relationship. It's about our relationship with the One who made us and how we respond.

If you'd like to come and find out more about prayer, different types of prayer, be prayed for, be prayed with, or just come and sit in the atmosphere of prayer, St James church will be hosting an evening of prayer on Friday March 20th at 20:00. This is part of our commitment to the 2020 initiative to make this year a year of prayer and committing to pray on the 20th of each month at 20:00 (8pm) for 20 minutes.

All are welcome to come and explore and we pray that He may give us eyes to see and thankful hearts to respond.

The Electoral Roll is a list of names and addresses of everyone who wishes to play a full part in the life of the church. It entitles you to vote at our annual meeting [APCM] and to stand for election to membership of the PCC. If your name is currently on the Roll, you need do nothing. If you would like your name added to the Roll, please complete an application form [found on the round table at the back of church].

To qualify, you need to be over 16 years old, have been baptised, and have worshipped at St. James' for six months. You should be a member of the Church of England or of any church in communion with the Church of England, or of any church which believes in the Holy Trinity.

You can be on the Electoral Roll of more than one parish [e.g. if you live in one parish but worship in another]. You should choose which parish you want to vote in, as you may only vote in one.

Completed forms may be handed to me, or delivered to the church office. The Roll will be closed after Sunday 22nd March.

Our Guest Speaker, Gary Wooding, will be talking to us about REMAP, a national charity solely devoted to the provision of custom designed technical aids for disabled people. As with many charities, REMAP began in a small way some 50 years ago when an ICI engineer began to devise technical aids to help his sister who had suffered from polio. The commercial market provides a wide variety of mass-produced aids for people with disabilities, ranging from wheelchairs to specially shaped spoons, all of which are targeted at the most commonly encountered problems of disability.

However, there is still a requirement for the tailor-made, one-off design and also for adaptations to the commercially available aids. This is where REMAP comes into its own through a network of over 900 skilled volunteers responding to thousands of requests every year all of which are provided free of charge.

Our February event was at the maximum of 30 with 3 on the reserve list, so our "first come, first served" mantra becomes more important with each passing month. Don't miss out on the March one.
